

Resolution No. 57/2024-2028 of the Senate of Poznan University of Technology of 20 June 2025

on the amendment of Resolution No. 185/2024–2028 of the Senate of Poznan University of Technology of 24 April 2024 on the conditions and procedure for admission to studies in the 2025/2026 academic year

Acting pursuant to Article 33 Section 1 of the Act of 4 April 2025 amending certain acts to eliminate irregularities in the visa system of the Republic of Poland (Journal of Laws of 2025, item 622), in connection with Article 70 Section 5g and Article 28 Section 1 Point 10 of the Act of 20 July 2018 – Law on Higher Education and Science (Journal of Laws of 2024, item 1571, as amended), the Senate of Poznan University of Technology hereby **resolves** the following:

§ 1

In Resolution No. 185/2024–2028 of the Senate of Poznan University of Technology of 24 April 2024 on the conditions and procedure for admission to studies in the 2025/2026 academic year, the following amendments are introduced:

- 1) in § 1 Section 3, after the words "admission to studies", the words "of Polish citizens" shall be added;
- 2) in § 1, after Section 3, Section 3a is added with the following wording:
 - "3a. Decisions regarding the admission of foreign nationals to studies shall be taken by the Rector. The recruitment process shall be conducted by the International Student Recruitment Committee (ISRC), appointed by the Rector.";
- 3) in § 2 Section 6, after the words "under the rules set out", the words "in § 3a, § 4a and" shall be added";
- 4) after § 3, § 3a is added with the following wording:

"§ 3a

- 1. A foreign national may be admitted to first-cycle studies if they hold a certificate of secondary school graduation or another document referred to in Article 69 Section 2 of the Law on Higher Education and Science.
- 2. Upon submission of an equivalent school-leaving certificate to the ISRC, it is the Committee's responsibility to convert the grades from the certificate to the scale applicable in the Polish education system.
- 3. The University shall verify the foreign national's proficiency in the language of instruction of the firstcycle studies at a language competence level of at least B2, based on a document specified in regulations issued pursuant to Article 70 Section 5f of the Law on Higher Education and Science.
- 4. Foreign nationals holding a document referred to in Article 326a Section 1 of the Law on Higher Education and Science shall be admitted to first-cycle studies under the rules set out in § 3, excluding the provisions of § 3 Section 3.
- 5. Foreign nationals not holding a document referred to in Article 326a Section 1 of the Law on Higher Education and Science shall be admitted to first-cycle studies under the rules set out in § 3:

- 1) excluding the provisions of § 3 Section 3,
- 2) and shall sit an entrance examination conducted to assess knowledge necessary for undertaking studies, as referred to in Article 70 Section 5b Point 3a of the Law on Higher Education and Science; a condition for proceeding to the next stage of the qualification procedure is passing the examination, i.e. achieving a minimum score of 30%,
- 3) in addition, during the recruitment process, they shall submit a document issued abroad by a school or educational institution recognised by the state in whose territory or within whose education system it operates, together with a written statement concerning that document issued by the Director of the National Agency for Academic Exchange NAWA confirming the entitlement to apply for admission to studies, or in the cases referred to in Article 93a of the Act of 7 September 1991 on the Education System, as well as in Article 70 Section 5b Point 1 of the Law on Higher Education and Science a written statement issued by the Director of the National Agency for Academic Exchange NAWA confirming such entitlement, or a decision of the education superintendent recognising secondary education and the right to apply for admission to higher education.
- 6. The aptitude assessment referred to in § 3 Section 2 Point 2, for foreign nationals, shall consist of an evaluation of a portfolio. A condition for proceeding to the next stage of the qualification procedure is a positive result in the aptitude assessment, i.e. achieving a minimum of 120 points."
- 5) after § 4, § 4a is added with the following wording:

"§ 4a

- 1. A foreign national may be admitted to second-cycle studies if they hold a diploma of graduation from first-cycle or long-cycle Master's studies.
- Foreign nationals holding the document referred to in Article 326 Section 1 or Article 327 Section 1 of the Law on Higher Education and Science shall be admitted to second-cycle studies under the rules set out in § 4.
- 3. Foreign nationals not holding a document referred to in Article 326 Section 1 or Article 327 Section 1 of the Law on Higher Education and Science shall be admitted to second-cycle studies under the rules set out in § 4, and shall also submit, during the recruitment process, a diploma of graduation issued abroad by a higher education institution recognised by the state in whose territory or higher education system it operates, together with a written statement concerning the diploma issued by the Director of the National Agency for Academic Exchange NAWA confirming eligibility to apply for admission to studies, as referred to in Article 70 Section 5d Point 1 of the Law on Higher Education and Science.
- 4. Upon submission to the ISRC of an equivalent diploma of graduation, along with the documents referred to in § 9 Section 1 Point 2c, it is the Committee's responsibility to verify the learning outcomes achieved based on a list of subjects studied by the candidate at the previous stage of education. Candidates who meet the requirements shall be referred to an entrance examination in the form of a qualification interview or test, conducted online or in person, to assess their aptitude for undertaking the studies.
- 5. The University shall verify the foreign national's proficiency in the language of instruction of the second-cycle studies at a level of language competence not lower than B2, based on a document

specified in regulations issued pursuant to Article 70 Section 5f of the Law on Higher Education and Science."

§ 2

The Senate authorises the Rector, as Chair of the Senate, to publish a consolidated version of the resolution on the conditions and procedure for admission to studies in the 2025/2026 academic year, incorporating the amendments introduced by this resolution and previous amendments.

§ 3 This Resolution shall enter into force on the date of its adoption.
